PREFACE.

WE have the direction by divine authority, through Moses, "Remember the days of old, consider the years of many generations; ask thy father and he will show thee; thy elders, and they will tell thee." *Deut.* xxxii, 7. Much interest has been taken, during the last thirty or forty years, in the collection and arrangement of Family Histories and Genealogies. As a result of these efforts there have been laid before the public many interesting compilations. Circumstances and events that must otherwise, in the natural order of things, soon have passed into oblivion, are thus placed on record, for the benefit of the present and future generations. From the events and occurrences of the past, it is the part of wisdom to derive instruction and guidance for the activities of the future.

In this volume it is intended to give a history of JASPER GRIFFING, a native of Wales, who settled in Southold, Long Island, about two centuries ago, and of his descendants down to the present time so far as known.

Some of those who have borne the Griffing name have risen to eminence and distinction, gaining a world-

wide reputation. Many more have "acted well their parts" in the humbler walks of life, and are equally entitled to our esteem and commendation.

The records and material for this work were collected by Miss Clara J. Stone [Number 494 of this volume]. She devoted her time for three or four years with much enthusiasm and energy to the accomplishment of the work, and to that end carried on an extensive correspondence with individuals in all parts of this country, and to some extent in Europe. In addition to what is here presented to the public, she collected much interesting matter in connection with representatives of the family, for which there is no room in this volume. When her collection and compilation were substantially completed, and the work was nearly ready for the press, she was suddenly stricken with disease, and died, after an illness of four days, on the 25th day of March, 1880.

Thanks are due to Dr. Alvan Talcott of Guilford, Ct., Miss Harriet Lord of Lyme, Ct., George B. Griffin of San Francisco, Cal., Mrs. C. G. Allen of Ravenswood, Augusta, Ga., Mrs. N. O. Randall of Yaphank, L. I., and others, for the valuable assistance rendered by them to Miss Stone in the collection of these records.

GENEALOGY

OF

THE DESCENDANTS OF JASPER GRIFFING.

THE Gruffids of Welsh history are considered by many antiquarians of the present day as Griffings. A strong tradition has come down through all the lines that the last prince of Wales, *Llewellyn ap Griffith ap Llewellyn*, is the progenitor of all. A record connected with the Tower of London calls one of these a Griffing. The Virginia Griffings, who are descendants of Cyrus Griffing of the Provincial Congress, and are not of the Jasper line, have the same tradition.

Of the early history of Jasper Griffing very little is known. He was born in Wales about 1648, and came to this country when quite young. We have a slight notice of him in Essex Co., Mass., in 1670, when he is said to be twenty-one years of age. We have still another notice in Marblehead, Mass., in 1674. Soon after this date, and about 1675, he came, with a young wife named Hannah, to Southold, L. I., where he spent his subsequent life. The family name of his wife, Hannah, has not been ascertained. The inscription on her tombstone reads; "Here lyeth the body of Hannah Griffing, wife of Jasper Griffing, born at Manchester, New England," [Mass.?] "aged 46 years and eight months, and was the mother of eighteen children, and departed this life in Southold the 20th day of April, 1699." Jasper Griffing died at Southold, aged 70, April 17, 1718.

Of their "eighteen children," some of whom doubtless died in infancy, we have accounts of only four sons, Jasper, John, Edward, Robert, and a daughter, Susanna.

Respecting the orthography of the name there is a decided lack of uniformity. Jasper and his descendants at Southold, and

also the Robert Griffing branch, of Guilford and other places, spell the name with the final "g," *Griffing*. Other branches as uniformly omit the final "g," and spell the name *Griffin*. But all these are, without doubt, descendants of the same ancestor, Jasper Griffing of Southold. For the sake of uniformity the names of all his descendants are given in this volume in *his* orthography, *Griffing*.

Jasper Griffing, Jun., probably eldest son of Jasper Griffing of Southold (1) and Hannah, his wife; married, 29 April, 1696, Ruth Peck, born 19 August, 1676, daughter of Joseph Peck of Lyme, Ct., and Sarah, his wife. In Lyme all the children of Joseph and Sarah Peck were born. [This Joseph Peck was the son of Deacon Wm. Peck of New Haven, who was born in England, 1603.] It is said in "Griffin's Journal," that Jasper Griffing, Jun., purchased a tract of land in Lyme and settled there. By reference to "Southold Index of 1698," by Chas B. Moore, Esq., we find a note of Jasper, at the time of his father's death, 1718, where he is spoken of as a son and heir reciting his father's will, etc., and at the same time disposing of his possessions at Southold to his brother Edward Griffing.

It is also said in the "Journal" that he lived to be more than 90 years old, but the date of his death does not appear.

Edward Griffing, son of Jasper Griffing (1) and Hannah, his wife, married, 1st, Irene ———, who died 8 Nov., 1716; 2d, Sarah Meaker, on the 1 Oct., 1717. Nothing further found.

Susanna Griffing, daughter of Jasper Griffing (1) and Hannah, his wife, married 4 Oct., 1704, Joseph Peck, Jun., born 20 March, 1680, son of Joseph and Sarah Peck of Lyme, Ct. Probably the name of the children of this union are recorded in the "History of the Descendants of Wm. Peck of New Haven," by Judge Darius Peck of Hudson, N. Y. None are found in the records of the Griffings. Joseph and Susanna Peck lived at Lyme, Ct.

6.

Robert Griffing, born 1685, son of Jasper Griffing (1) and Hannah, his wife, was born at his father's homestead "at the foot of town harbor lane" leading from the main street to the harbor. He married about 1708 Lydia Kirkland, born 11 Oct., 1685, daughter of Lieut. John Kirkland of Saybrook, Ct., and Lydia

(Pratt) Kirkland, daughter of Lieut. Wm. Pratt, also of Saybrook. It is said of Robt. Griffing that he was "a man of most agreeable conversation and greatly beloved."

Although Robert was the fourth son yet we find him at last in possession of the homestead, and it seemed to come about in this way: As Jasper, Jun., had removed to Lyme, Ct., a deed of sale was executed 1 June, 1718, about two months after his father's death, by which Jasper of Lyme transferred all the real estate he owned to his brother Edward. The same year we find that Edward and Sarah (Meaker) Griffing gave a deed of the homestead and lands he possessed at Southold to his brother Robert. Again referring to "Griffin's Journal:" "Where Edward settled, what family he had, how long he lived, we are not able to say. So Robert settled down on his father's estate and homestead on the pleasant banks of Peconic Bay, at Southold Harbor." Besides cultivating his patrimonial land at Hallock's Neck and the islands near by.

We find incidentally that in 1725 Robert Griffing kept an "Inn," that *dernier resort* of so many of our ancestors who came to *do*, and finding a sterile soil *did* whatever was honest to eke out an independent living. Robert Griffing died at the homestead 28 March, 1729. His wife Lydia made a second marriage with Joseph Conkling of Southold, who died 1740; she died in 1742.

He married as second wife Anna Swezey, daughter of Richard and Abiah Swezey of Riverhead.

John Griffing with his family removed during the war of the Revolution to Lyme or Middletown, Ct., it is not known which. He died while in exile, and tradition says at Guilford, Conn., and was buried there. Anna Griffing united with the Church at

Upper Acquebogue 18 Feby., 1767; her husband with same Church 10 April, 1767. She died 3 Jany., 1803.

Samuel Griffing, born 25 Sept., 1710, O. S., son of Robert Griffing (6) and Lydia (Kirkland) Griffing, married, 1732, Elizabeth Landon, born 14 June, 1710, O. S., daughter of Nathan Landon of Southold, who came from Herefordshire, England; born 1664; came to America; married; and died at Southold 1718, aged 54 years.

Samuel Griffing was but nineteen years of age when his father died, and we find him soon after this event as eldest son in possession of the homestead, assuming charge of the family and

the guardianship of his youngest brother Jasper, who was at his father's death but seven years old. The mother, Lydia (Kirkland) Griffing, married, 1732, a second husband.

Elizabeth (Landon) Griffing was the mother of thirteen children, eleven of whom survived her. The entry in the family Bible, made by her husband at the time of her death, reads thus: "Aug. 19, 1755, departed this life my own wife, Elizabeth." He married as second wife, 25 May, 1756, Martha Vaill, by whom he had four children.

In the large family which Samuel Griffing reared, there was the most marked loyalty to parents, and the most devoted love preserved between the numerous brothers and sisters even to old age. The grandmother of the writer always prefaced everyone of these, to her, precious household names, with "brother," "sister," down to her dying day. The father's was an iron will, as was wont in those Puritan days; but there was perfect love and veneration for him notwithstanding. The step-mother, too, filled in a wonderful way the place of the beloved Elizabeth Landon, and the writer knows, by her own remembrance, that no two sisters ever loved one another more fondly than the step-sisters who both married in Guilford.

In the autumn of 1776, as the British were taking possession of Long Island, many families fled panic-struck at their approach, and left their homesteads to the mercy of the invaders. Hon. Ezra L'Hommedieu and Samuel Griffing, whose houses stood not more than thirty rods apart, and who were closely attached by ties of neighborhood and friendship, both left with their immediate families for Connecticut.

By reference to the incidents of Jasper Griffing's life in a succeeding page, it will be seen that he had settled down in the town of Guilford, Ct., some thirty years previous to this; had become a prosperous citizen, owning houses and lands; and more, had just completed the purchase of the Whitfield House, or Stone House as it is called in common parlance to this day, and in this house our exile, with his wife, two daughters and two sons, found a home for a year or more. By this time a farm was

found to his liking and purchased in the town of Branford, but a few miles west of Guilford, to which he soon removed. In 1787 his two daughters, Elizabeth and Mary, both married and settled in Guilford. Solomon Stone, a descendant of John Stone from England, marrying Elizabeth, and Medad Stone, a descendant of William Stone (John's brother) from England, marrying Mary.

Samuel Griffing died 1789; Martha (Vaill) Griffing died 1791.

Samuel Griffing never returned to live in his Long Island home after he went to Connecticut—only returned to see his house a wreck, a “cannon planted in the window,” and the like.

It will be seen that in 1794 Parnal Bates married her first cousin, Timothy Griffing of Guilford, Conn. [No. 84]. Of Norton Bates nothing more is known but that he settled in Massachusetts, and was a most excellent man.

Jasper Griffing, born 7 March, 1722, O. S., son of Robert Griffing (6) and Lydia (Kirkland) Griffing, married, 14 Jany., 1746, Mindwell Stone, born 22 Sept., 1720, daughter of Serjeant Joseph and Mary (Scranton) Stone of Guilford, Ct. Mindwell Griffing died 22 April, 1760. He married second, about 1761, Rachel Lee, born 23 Feby., 1727, daughter of Ebenezer and Sarah (Chidsey) Lee. Jasper Griffing died at Guilford 1 Nov., 1800. Rachel Lee, his wife, died 4 March, 1811, aged 84 years.

The early life of Jasper Griffing was an eventful one. As we have seen, his father died when he was a little child; at fifteen or sixteen he seems to have become a sailor, going to the West Indies, &c. When about twenty-three years of age he was impressed into Commodore Warren's fleet, then lying at New York. Tradition hath it that intercession was made by the relatives, to the Commodore for his release, through Samuel Landon, Esq., the brother of Mrs. Samuel Griffing of Southold, and that a promise was made that he should be returned in the pilot-boat from Sandy Hook, a promise that was not kept. But the reader is here referred to notes from the Journal of Rev. Henry Robinson of Guilford, who writes as follows:

"On the 10th Aug., 1837, when I was at the house of Mr. Russell Griffing, in Richmond, Mass., the following story was told me by Mr. G. respecting his father, Capt. Jasper Griffing: In the year

1745, when young Griffing was about 23, he was pressed on board Com. Warren's fleet at New York, together with a number of others. Through the entreaty of friends, Griffing was promised by the Commodore that he should be set ashore at Sandy Hook, but the promise was disregarded. Afterwards, while on the West India Station, he, with two others, deserted, swam ashore in the night, and soon got on board an American vessel. Not long after the English fleet hove in sight, and a boat was sent alongside of the American vessel with an officer, who at once recognized the deserters. They were taken on board the Commodore's ship and condemned to be hung. On the morning of the fatal day, Griffing summoned up courage to write a note to the Commodore to this effect; that if the Commodore had been as good as his word he (Griffing) should not be hung that day. Immediately after they were ordered to be brought forth to execution. Griffing fell on his knees and pleaded for his life. The Commodore asked him what he meant by sending him such a note. He replied that he had written nothing but the truth, that it was promised he should be set ashore or sent back by the pilot-boat to New York. On being asked if he could show proof of this, he referred to an American lieutenant on board, who confirmed the truth of his story. The Commodore then asked him if he would swear—on his knees—to be true to his sovereign, and serve him faithfully in the future in case his life was spared, to which he gladly assented, and was discharged, while the other two were swung from the yard-arm." It is well known that during the war called in America "King George's War"—which took place between 1744 and 1748—Com. Warren, in 1745, received orders from England to co-operate with the land forces from the New England colonies in the attempt to take Louisburg, on the island of Cape Breton. A company of men commanded by Col. Andrew Ward went from Guilford, Ct. Jasper Griffing's brother Robert from Southold was already settled in this place, and he (Robert) requested Col. Ward to look for his brother. Col. Ward made inquiries among the sailors as he met them, found the very man, and devised at once a way of escape for him. After his escape the Colonel had him dressed as

a "countryman soldier, without uniform and with a flapped hat." In this disguise he soon met an officer who, with his glass, was making observations upon the works of the enemy. The officer called upon our friend to steady his glass for him, which he did but without discovery. It was so managed that he was sent to the hospital as a sick soldier, and finally to Boston on the sick list, whence he came to Guilford, and soon marrying Mindwell Stone, settled down and ultimately became one of its wealthiest citizens. On account of his hairbreadth escapes from Commodore Warren's fleet, he was in his lifetime and ever after called "The Commodore."

In an historic letter written by Mr. Jared Griffing in 1839, he says: "My uncle Jasper told me that he sat on the main top-gallant truck of Warren's ship when it entered the harbor of Louisburg under the fire of the French."

[An item of historical interest may be added here, viz.: That Jasper Griffing became, by purchase in 1776, the fifth owner of the "Old Stone House," still standing and in fine condition in Guilford. It was built by the first settlers about 1640; was owned and occupied by Rev. Henry Whitfield of historic memory. Rev. Mr. Whitfield returned to England about 1651, and sold it to Major Robert Thompson of London, in 1659. All the Whitfield land was acknowledged by letters from his brother, Nathaniel Whitfield of London, 20 Sept., 1659. Wyllis Elliott of Guilford bought the house in 1772; Thomas Pyncheon of Guilford in 1772; and Jasper Griffing bought it of him in 1776. From him it descended to his son Judge Nathaniel Griffing; at the death of his widow, Mrs. Sarah (Brown) Griffing, in 1865, it came to their only remaining child, Mrs. H. W. Chittenden, and at her death, in 1878, her only child, Mrs. Sarah B. Cone of Stockbridge, Mass., became the possessor of it.]

Dorr is supposed to be the progenitor of all the Dorr's of New England. He came to this country from the west of England, was born in 1648, and came here about 1670, and settled at Boston. He married his first wife, Elizabeth Hawley, previous to 1680. They removed to Roxbury where she died; he died in 1734. One son, Rev. Joseph Dorr, born 1690, graduated at Harvard 1711, was settled as a minister at Meriden, Ct., in 1716, and died 9 March, 1768. Another son, Edmund, married Mary Griswold as above. Harbottle Dorr, born 11 May, 1696, married Dorothy Weld, and settled at Boston. A daughter Elizabeth, born 1698, married James Scott of Boston. Another daughter, Clemence, born 17 July, 1700, married Edmund Weld of Roxbury. Edmund Dorr and Mary (Griswold) Dorr settled at Lyme, where he carried on the business of clothier or cloth dresser. He was a man of mind and indomitable perseverance. During a persistent ecclesiastical controversy which he and a few other members of the church maintained with Rev. Jonathan Parsons, third minister of Lyme, he obtained the sobriquet of “Servant Dorr,” which he retained for life. He died at Lyme, date not ascertained.

For some years he had charge of the lighthouse on Falkner's Island, in Long Island Sound, about five miles from Guilford. But as remembered by the writer, he lived a quiet life in his advanced years at his very pleasant home on the west side of Guilford Green, a quaint but lovely house, with its tasteful adornments of the olden time. "Aunt Ruth," its mistress, quaint, too, but dignified and ladylike, as became her antecedents. "Uncle Jo" was more than six feet in height, well-proportioned, with the carriage of a prince. One who looked upon the pageant in London, at the coronation of William the Fourth, was asked how he looked. "Like Uncle Jo Griffing," was the quick reply. At the age of about eighty-three he lost his wife; his sons were all dead; his only daughter married and living in another State. He wished to return to the home of his youth. On the 23 April, 1839, he left Guilford and found a quiet resting-place among his kindred near Riverhead. Capt. Daniel Griffing, born 12 May, 1736, son of Samuel Griffing (16) and Elizabeth (Landon) Griffing, was at the early age of twenty in the French war. In 1759 he became a lieutenant in Capt. Barnabas Tuthill's company of Suffolk Co., N. Y.; in 1760 a captain of 36 men; in 1762 a captain of a full company.

He married, 1758, Martha, (called Patty) Case, born 13 June, 1737, of the old Case family of Southold. Soon after the battle of Lexington we find Daniel Griffing in the Continental army, a commissioned captain of a company numbering 76 men or more. From his "Orderly Book," now lying by the writer, it is found that an account was opened with them as early as August, 1775,

and perhaps earlier. We find him indebted to his father—Samuel Griffing—for twenty-eight stands of arms; an entry made in the book, dated 9 July, 1776, speaks of a payment made to his father of £47 5s., etc., for said arms; and again, 11 July, 1776, another of £12, used probably in the service. In the "Orderly Book" above we find him mentioned, under date of 25 Aug., 1776, as Capt. Daniel Griffing, of 2d Regt., New York forces, commanded by Col. James Clinton (afterward Gen. Clinton), the father of De Witt Clinton. In the Fall of 1775 he was at Ticonderoga, Albany, etc. On one page is to be seen a receipt of full payment to his men, including billet, blanket, and other moneys, up to 1 Aug., 1776, every man signing the receipt with his own hand. Seventy-six signatures, some of the names most strangely written, and as strangely spelt. The last entry in the book is dated Fort Montgomery, 1 Jany., 1777, and is a payment acknowledged by Joseph Conkling. About this time Capt. Griffing seems to have left the army. Falling back upon tradition, he is said to have sailed in the "Randolph"—a privateer fitted out at one of our ports—accompanied by his brother-in-law, Capt. Augustus Peck, who, by this time, with his family was settled at Killingworth, Conn. It is said they were very successful in obtaining prizes, and stored what they obtained at New London, Ct. But, alas for them! their riches disappeared on that day when the plundering expedition, under Benedict Arnold, set on fire and burned New London, 6 Sept., 1781. Just about this time we find Capt. Griffing making a new home for his family on one of the several hills near Saybrook, Ct., accompanied by a Mr. L'Hommedieu (perhaps a brother or nephew of the Hon. Ezra L'Hommedieu, who had made himself so efficient a helper in the provincial cause on Long Island and in the Councils of New York). He was the boy friend and schoolmate of the subject of this paper, and through him Capt. Griffing probably received his commission in the army. As far as is now ascertained, Captain Griffing received next to no consideration from the Government in after years, and now, at fifty years of age, he was left penniless. He left his home on the hill and retired to the seashore. The name given to the spot

was "Waterside," and there, as a recluse, he spent the remainder of his days; as one who as a boy knew him now says, "A man of great ability in a constrained place." His bearing was such that it is said the young looked upon him with great awe. The death of this old revolutionary officer took place 22 June, 1822, in his eighty-seventh year. Martha, his wife, died soon after in the same year.

James Griffing, born 14 October, 1739, son of Samuel Griffing (16) and Elizabeth (Landon) Griffing of Southold, married, 1764, Deziah Terry, born February, 1746, daughter of Jonathan and Lydia (Tuthill) Terry of Oysterponds, now Orient, Suffolk Co., New York. He held a commission in the war of the Revolution for about two years, then retired to Southold, and for a time, at the request of Hon. Ezra L'Hommedieu, occupied his deserted mansion, taking the charge of his place and that of his father (Samuel Griffing) near by, who had left his homestead and gone to Connecticut with a portion of his family. As the British were quartered in his vicinity, he suffered untold indignities from them, as

well as from the violent tories in the same neighborhood. His life was frequently in danger, and often he would be obliged to leave his family for days together, and hide himself from his enemies as best he might. Many of his escapes from the British were almost miraculous, so much so that his wife, who was eminently pious, would say: "They that be for us are more than they that be against us." On the occasion of Mrs. Griffing's death, her son, Augustus Griffing, made an entry in his "Journal" (p. 99) full of words of affection for her as daughter, wife, mother, and neighbor; and about the same time Wm. L. Hudson, Esq., Capt. in U. S. Navy, in one of the New York papers paid a beautiful tribute to her memory [see Journal, p. 100]. She died 14 November, 1814. James Griffing died 10 December, 1824.

Capt. Peter Griffing, born 2 Sept., 1742, son of Samuel Griffing (16) and Elizabeth (Landon) Griffing, married, ——. Patience Tabor, daughter of Amon and Mary Tabor of Oysterponds, now Orient, N. Y. "He owned and was the captain of a sailing vessel before the Revolutionary war, from which he realized a good support ; trading probably from port to port on the island and with Connecticut." But after the war commenced great risks were incurred, and his position was a dangerous one. His escapes from the British cruisers, says a relative, were perfectly wonderful ; and, what is more, we cannot but think, on reading of his adventures on the sea and on the shore, that he greatly enjoyed these escapades with the enemy. His old King's arm was as trusty a helper to him as was his "long rifle" to Leather Stocking.

He was one of the most noted marksmen of his day as well as a man of remarkable bravery. A younger brother of his (Jared) leaves this on record: "My brother Peter never found a man during the war that could excel him in close shooting." March 28, 1777, his vessel, "The Polly," was captured by the English sloop-of-war "Swan," Capt. Ayscough, commander. But our brave friend and true patriot was not idle. We will here quote from "Hinman's Collection of Public Records of Connecticut:" "2 Sept., 1777. A commission was given by the Governor to Peter Griffing as a captain of a company of rangers to guard the seacoast, sound, and islands on the coast of this State, to make prisoners of such as he should take in arms against the State. Instructions were given said Griffing," etc. His young brother Jared (before mentioned) says of him after this appointment: "I was with him in action, and it was observed when he fired one of the enemy was sure to fall. We were volunteers at New Haven when the British took and burned the city, 5 July, 1779. We

took six grenadiers and eleven stands of arms, and drove them off the ground until they were re-enforced, when we in turn retreated. My poor brother Peter fell into the hands of the enemy, and was put on board the prison-ship 'Jersey,' near New York City, where he died in 1781 or 1782. The enemy so well understood his ability in the use of fire-arms, that they would not exchange him for any one of equal rank as prisoner." After his death his widow made a second marriage with Judge — Wells of Stonington, Conn.

Moses Griffing, born 6 Sept., 1745, son of Samuel Griffing (16) and Elizabeth (Landon) Griffing, like several of his elder brothers, early became a sailor, and ere he was twenty-five years of age we find him commanding a ship and trading with the West Indies. Two of his brothers had already found early graves in those islands, one in Martinico, one in Antigua. Capt. Griffing, about 1769 or 1770, had occasion to visit the New Jersey coast in the way of his business. At Beesley's Point, Cape May Co., he became acquainted with the Stillwell family, and with Miss Sarah Stillwell, who was to become his faithful and, as we shall see, heroic wife. She was born 13 Nov., 1753. Her father was Nicholas Stillwell, son of John Stillwell of Town Bank, a place not far distant. Nicholas Stillwell was a member of the Legislature of the Colony from 1769 to 1771. He purchased, in 1748, the plantation at Beesley's Point. After his death it fell to his son, Capt.

Nicholas Stillwell, who was afterward an efficient officer of the Revolution. Capt. Griffing was married to Sarah Stillwell about 1770. Her mother was Ruhamah (Hand) Stillwell. The Hands were among the earliest settlers of Cape May County. After marriage the home of this pair was for a little time in New Jersey; but ere long they removed to Philadelphia, Penn. From that place Capt. Griffing continued for many years to make voyages to distant ports. A Bible, containing much family record written by his own hand, is still preserved with great care by his granddaughter, Mrs. John W. Gandy of Cape May Court House. This Bible was his companion in his many voyages, and it is said by one of his descendants that more than forty times did he read it through. That he had an adventurous life we may rest assured, and on one occasion he was taken prisoner by the English and placed on the "infamous and murderous Jersey prison-ship," where the dying, the dead, and the famished were promiscuously huddled together. In connection with Capt. Griffing's imprisonment, we quote what follows from the "Early History of Cape May," by Dr. Maurice Beesley. He says: "The young Mrs. Griffing, actuated by a heroism which woman's love alone can inspire, bravely made her way through a most dangerous country swarming with enemies, romantically resolved to see and rescue her husband, or die in the attempt. The devoted wife called at the camp of Washington by the way, who gave her in charge an English captain to exchange. She reached New York in safety, and finally persuaded Sir Henry Clinton to release her husband. The exchange was made after a long and painful suspense, and the heroic wife enjoyed the happiness she deserved." Capt. Moses Griffing died in Philadelphia 7 July, 1802. Sarah (Stillwell) Griffing died in Philadelphia 13 May, 1804. Record below from the old Bible.

Elizabeth Griffing, born 17 February, 1755, was the third daughter and thirteenth child of Samuel Griffing (16) and Elizabeth (Landon) Griffing. When but five months old she lost her mother; her brothers were, some of them, at the time of her birth, stalwart men; and when at home tenderly did they care for this little one; and her love to them was ever of the most devoted kind. When she had reached the age of twenty years the war of the Revolution commenced. Many were the portents of evil to the patriotic citizens of Long Island. The battle near Brooklyn, on the 27 August, 1776, was disastrous to the Americans. But a short time elapsed ere the island was in full possession of the British. Her father had doubtless signed the paper with more than two hundred to support Congress. He had lent money with which to furnish stands of arms. He had a son already commissioned as captain of a company mostly composed of Suffolk Co. men; and, as a matter of safety, he must leave the island with his then small family for the safer shores of Connecticut. To leave her pleasant home on the banks of Peconic Bay, her much-loved garden-plot, all familiar surroundings, was hard for our grandmother. She lived over much of this time in her after life; hence there was an historic glow in the recital of bygone days which was wonderfully interesting to the young of her own family group. The father removed his family to Guilford in the fall of 1776. After a time he purchased and made a new home in Branford, and here she married, 5 August, 1787, Solomon Stone, born 23 October, 1740, son of Caleb and Rebecca (Evarts) Stone of Guilford. [Solomon Stone was son of Caleb Stone, Jun., b. 7 May, 1714, the son of Caleb Stone, Sen., b. 10 Nov., 1685, son of Lieut. Nathaniel Stone, b. 2 Feby, 1648, son of John Stone, from England. All of Guilford, Ct.] In this new home at Guilford she

filled a large place; she brought up orphans, visited the sick and afflicted, fed the hungry, and ministered in all pleasant ways to the comfort of the townspeople, and was proverbially known as the good "Aunt Betsey." Solomon Stone, her husband, died 13 July, 1814. She lived to a good old age, dying in the same house to which she came as a bride in 1787. Her death took place 15 May, 1838.

Stone from England, who with his brother John were among the earliest settlers of Guilford, and were both signers with others of the so-called "Plantation Covenant."] Medad Stone was a man of prominence in the town, and a man of wealth. He died 17 Feby., 1815. His wife was of commanding appearance, and of great executive ability. She died 31 Dec., 1826.

Kirkland Griffing, born 23 Oct., 1752, son of Deacon Robert Griffing (20) and Rhoda (Parmele) Griffing, went early to sea and had an adventurous career, which is only known by tradition and portions of old letters which we quote. As he finally settled at or near Utica, N. Y., it is to be supposed that he may have descendants in that part of the country, but as yet no clue to such has been found. Extract from a letter written by Jared Griffing, Esq., to his kinsman of the Willetts family in New Jersey, dated "Southold, L. I., June, 1839."—"My uncle Robert Griffing lived and died in Guilford, Conn. He had two sons and three daughters." [On the Guilford record are the names of five sons, viz.: 1st, Robert, b. 1745, d. 1765; 2d, Rossiter, b. 1746, d. unknown, said to have married a Miss Lyons and gone South; 5th, Kirkland, b. 1752; 6th, Billy, b. 1755, d. 1756; 7th, William, b. 1757. Of the three daughters we can give the descendants of but one, Lydia, No. 75.—C. J. S.] "His sons Kirkland and Preston" [prob. William, then 22 yrs. old.—C. J. S.] "were taken prisoners in the Revolutionary war. They were officers on board a privateer from Providence, R. I., and were captured by the British man-of-war 'Nonesuch,' of 64 guns, commanded by Capt. Sam'l Griffing, who, they said, resembled our family. They were taken to England and imprisoned in the Mill Prison two years and ten months. While in prison as rebels they wrote to Sir John Griffing, who resided in Yorkshire, Sir John came to see them in a coach and six horses. He recognized them as a branch of his family, and told them that if

they were imprisoned for debt he would be glad to release them, but as they were prisoners of war, and he belonged to the king's party, he could not interfere in their behalf. He gave them ten guineas, and told them if they wanted any more to write to him again. They kept a school while on parole afterwards, and the Methodists showed them great kindness, and they lived quite comfortably until released, and then they returned to New England." [This from the letter of my great-uncle Jared Griffing—a man of great veracity—for many years a resident of Herkimer Co., N. Y., afterwards, in his old age, at Southold, L. I.—C. J. S.] A quotation will now be made from the "Journal" of Augustus Griffin. He says: "The sons of Robert Griffing, Jun., were Rossitter, Kirkland, and William. Kirkland was roving; made several voyages to sea. He was with Paul Jones on the "Bon Homme Richard" in her masterly and bloody engagement in which he captured two English frigates, the 'Serapis' and another, Sept. 23, 1779. After the war of the Revolution, he settled in Clinton Co., N. Y., where, much respected, he lived to an advanced life."

Nathan Landon, the ancestor of the Southold Landons, came from Herefordshire, Wales, and died 1718, aged 54 years. His wife was Hannah —, who died 26 Feby., 1701 or 1710. His eldest son was Nathan, Jun., born 1696; died 28 Sept., 1750. The Salmon Record states that he married Prudence Osman, though Chas. B. Moore, in his "Index of 1698," says Patience Osborn. The next son (and he is more particularly connected with the Griffing family) was Samuel Landon, born 20 May, 1699. He married Bethia Tuthill, born 1703; died 30 Aug., 1761. [NOTE 2.—Barnabas Horton, born at Mousely, Leicestershire, Eng., 1600; died 13 July, 1680, at Southold, L. I.; married Mary —, who survived him and was living in 1686. His youngest son, Capt. Jonathan Horton, born 1648, the first captain of cavalry in Suffolk Co., L. I., married Bethia Wells, daughter of William Wells, Esq., a man of note among the thirteen original settlers of Southold—a lawyer by profession. This William Wells was born in England 1618 (supposed to have been a son or connection of Rev. Wm. Wells, dean of Norwich, Eng.); died 13 Nov., 1671, aged 63. He married Mary —, a remarkable woman, she being the mother of Bethia Wells above. Bethia Horton, daughter of Jonathan and Bethia (Wells) Horton, married Henry Tuthill before 1698. This Henry Tuthill, Justice, was born 1665 and died 1750, the son of John Tuthill, born in England 16 July, 1635; died at Southold 12 Oct., 1717.]

Judge Griffing was for many years a prosperous merchant in his native town. For nearly ten years he held the office of Judge of the Court for New Haven County, and represented the town of Guilford in the Legislature of Connecticut thirty-five times; from 1819 to 1833 he was chosen each successive year. He was stricken with apoplexy while visiting at the house of Rev. E. P. Rogers of Northampton, Mass., and in three hours passed away, on the 17 Sept., 1845, aged 78 years. His widow survived him twenty years. As we are indebted to her for much that we know of the Griffings, therefore it is fitting that she herself should have no brief place in these annals. We are made free to draw from the "Address" made at her funeral by one of her most highly esteemed and trusted friends, Rev. Henry Robinson, late of Guilford, Ct. He says: "For the station she was called to fill she was admirably fitted. She had been religiously educated, and had also enjoyed great advantages for the cultivation of her mind, and was richly gifted with that native good sense, that quick perception of what is fitting and proper, that enabled her to act discreetly under all circumstances. The long life of Mrs. Griffing furnished her uncommon opportunities for acquiring a knowledge of the most important events in the history of her country. When Gen. Lafayette in 1778 passed through Guilford on his way to Rhode Island, he and his suite were entertained at the house of Mrs. Griffing's father, Esquire Samuel Brown. Though she was then but eleven years old the visit of the French General made an indelible impression upon her memory. The minutest circumstances connected with it were related by her to the writer within a few years of her death. Of the unwritten history of her time few have gained so extensive a knowledge. She was thoroughly acquainted with the history of her native town and of those who resided in it. Her memory continued unimpaired down to a late period in life, and she could draw at will from the ample store of knowledge for the instruction and entertainment of her friends, who hung upon her lips, delighted to find that the 'multitude of years could teach wisdom' and contribute so largely to their rational enjoyment. Mrs. Griffing was truly

an exemplary Christian; but she was more, for her piety was active and led her to use her abundant means in doing good to others. She entered heartily into the benevolent enterprises of her day, and the Bible, tract, and missionary societies had a firm friend in her. But while promoting the welfare of those far removed from her, our venerable friend did not neglect those of her own neighborhood. When far advanced in life she formed a plan to establish a seminary in her own town, where the young of both sexes might acquire an education fitting them for the duties and responsibilities of life. She lived to see this noble purpose carried into execution; to see a large and beautiful stone edifice erected amid pleasant grounds, and the seminary, under the name of the 'Guilford Institute,' put into successful operation. Some of those who were fitted for college at this school during its first years have made themselves a power in the army, in the pulpit, and through the press. As Mrs. Griffing lived to a very great age, so was she called to pay the inevitable tax on so long a life in being bereft of almost all her near relatives. Her husband died twenty years before her. Of her eight children, four were taken from her in childhood; two were removed in their youth; and one, a son on whom she leaned, sickened and died in the midst of a very active life. Only a daughter, Mrs. H. W. Chittenden, survives her. Mrs. Griffing died 1 June, 1865, within two days of the completion of her ninety-eighth year."

George Griffing, LL.D., born 14 Jany., 1778, son of George Griffing (30) and Eve (Dorr) Griffing, graduated at Yale 1797, became a lawyer, and received the degree of LL.D. from Columbia College in 1837. He went to Wilkesbarre, Penn., in order to practice his profession, and there married, 3 July, 1801, Lydia Butler, born 2 Oct., 1783, daughter of Col. Zebulon Butler of Wilkesbarre, and Phœbe (Haight) Butler of Fishkill, N. Y. Lately a paper belonging to the estate of said N. Griffing has been found, which is a receipt in full from Joseph Griffing to N. Griffing, Esq., of the legacy, dated 15 Sept., 1808; since which time no trace of Joseph Griffing is found.

One says of James Griffing, Jun., who knew him well: "Perhaps there never was a man more respected and esteemed by all who knew him. It were not saying too much, we believe, to declare he had no enemy. His every act was as if the Omniscient Eye was directly upon him. Unobtrusive, yet ever self-possessed and dignified in his manners, he seemed possessed of a spirit worthy of the best Roman, nay, of the highest Christian, for he repined at no adverse fortune, and could say and feel, even in the hour of his greatest Providential affliction, 'Thou doest all things well.'"

James Griffing died 21 Dec., 1852. His excellent wife died some years before him.

Caddle, a dignified Scotch minister of Oysterponds about the time of his birth. "He was a teacher for many years in Annapolis, Md." Later he removed to Orange Co., N. Y., where he ended a useful life. In the Journal of A. Griffin one says of him at his death: "He was learned and intelligent; punctilious in his dress; genteel in his appearance; polite in his manners; he was a philanthropist and a Christian; devoted to the progress of amelioration and happiness of his race. To the circle of his closest friends Mr. Griffing presented a character which they will cherish in their memories with the liveliest emotions of affection and gratitude." His death took place at Newburgh, N. Y., 24 Sept., 1854.

Experience Griffing, born 18 Jany., 1771, at Philadelphia, was the eldest child of Capt. Moses Griffing (61) and Sarah (Stillwell) Griffing. She could well remember the night when the watchman on the streets of Philadelphia called out: "Half-past two o'clock! Lord Cornwallis is taken!" and that her mother sprang out of bed, threw open the shutters, and found everybody astir; joy filled the city. Experience Griffing married, about 1795, Nicholas Willetts, born 10 April, 1769, at the homestead at Willetts' Point, Upper Township of Cape May Co., New Jersey. He was the youngest

son of James and Esther Willetts of the same place. When first married the young pair resided for a time at Beesley Point, but soon removed to the homestead (Willetts' Point), where their home continued to be, with the exception of one year, till the time of his death, about 1822. John Willetts, son of Hope Willetts, was born in Cape May Co. 1688, and married, in 1716, Martha Corson. He left three sons, Isaac, James, and Jacob. He was Judge of the Court for many years, and a member of Legislature in 1743. Nicholas Willetts was grandson of John. He lost his parents when young, at the beginning of the Revolutionary war. His older brothers went into the war, leaving the youngest, Nicholas, then about eight years old, to the care of an old slave of the family named Peg. She was highly esteemed by all its members, and took, no doubt, the best of care, physically at least, of the orphan boy. She was quite old and therefore often entertained him with stories connected with the early settlers—Indians, the wolves and well-guarded sheepfolds were the warp and woof of her stories, and very bewitching they doubtless were to the lonely boy. Situated as he was he could have but little schooling. He went to live with Mr. Eli Townsend to learn to be a farmer, and perhaps also a trade. After he reached the years of manhood he became studious, and in later years was a man of respectable attainments. He made a voyage or two to the West Indies, studied navigation and surveying, married the daughter of Capt. Griffing as said before, and settled on the homestead for life. His employment in the main was that of surveying and conveyancing, and he was much engaged in settling disputed claims. He had a remarkable tact at reconciling contending parties. As says his son in his Journal: "I have heard men say he was the only man whom everyone dared trust in dividing land alone, and settling controversies." He finished by actual survey the whole of Cape May Co., a considerable part of Gloucester (now Atlantic), and also the lower part of Cumberland Co. for Gordon's map of New Jersey, etc., and all the pecuniary compensation he received for his toils was one of those maps, worth at the time four dollars! He served in the legislature nine years. In those times when

party spirit ran high he was a Federalist, but had many friends among the Democrats. His personal appearance was fine; quoting again from the Journal—"His countenance beamed with intelligence and benevolence; he was full of humor and anecdotes, and his fine colloquial powers made him the life of the company he was in." His moral qualities were of the highest order. It was his constant aim to be a true neighbor and friend. His Quaker ancestors were honored by such a descendant, for the stock to which he belonged were of the Society of Friends, whose names especially abound in the Records of the town of Flushing, L. I., among the Lawrences, Halletts, and others of the 17th century.

Of Elizabeth (Griffing) Willetts we will quote from records of a son: "My mother was rather tall, straight, and well proportioned; of a fair complexion. She had a most tender and affectionate disposition, was dearly loved by her husband and her children, and by a large circle of friends. She had a large share of what might be called pride of ancestry, and raised her family so that its members would be an honor to any society. No poor person ever left our house hungry; my parents always sympathized with, and succored those in distress of any kind,"

Elizabeth Griffing, born 9 April, 1772, daughter of Capt. Moses Griffing (61) and Sarah (Stillwell) Griffing, married, 19 July, 1794, Capt. James Edwards of Philadelphia, born at Cape May, and son of Joseph Edwards. This family was of Welsh descent. Capt. Edwards was of the sea, and commanded his own ship. He died

27 Jany., 1807, while absent from his family on a voyage to the West Indies, leaving a widow with five children, all born in Philadelphia. Mrs. Edwards was a woman of rare qualities both of mind and heart, and withal attractive in her person. She reared and educated her children in the most admirable manner. All of them lived to be heads of families, except one son, who died when about seventeen. "Her children that remain rise up and call her blessed." One daughter married and went to reside in India; three made their homes in the South, and after this, rather late in life, we find Mrs. Edwards again married to Benjamin B. Hopkins, born in New York State, but a resident of Philadelphia, an elder in the Presbyterian Church. Mrs. Hopkins died at Savannah, Ga., 20 Feby., 1851; Mr. Hopkins, at Ravenswood, 26 Oct., 1852; both lie buried at Rose Hill Cemetery, Macon, Ga.

Moses Griffing (61) and Sarah (Stillwell) Griffing, married, 1st, Daniel Benizet of New Jersey, a nephew of the noted Anthony Benizet of Philadelphia. A letter from a young relative (Harry S. Edwards, Esq., Macon, Ga.) says: "Roxana Griffing Benizet was one of the most beautiful women in the State of Pennsylvania. I have her portrait painted by the celebrated Rembrandt Peale of Philadelphia, a model of art and beauty."

She was early left a widow, and married, 2d, Judge Parmenus Corson of New Jersey, whose homestead was on the sea, seven miles from Beesley Point. She soon died at Cape May, 17 May, 1806.

Capt. Moses Griffing, Jun., born 11 Feby., 1776, son of Capt. Moses Griffing (61) and Sarah (Stillwell) Griffing, married, —, Nancy Rapes of Egg Harbor, sister of Capt. Nicholas Rapes. Capt. Griffing was, like so many of his race, wedded to the sea, and was early in command of a ship. Without particularizing his early voyages, we can say that he sailed to various ports of Europe, up the Mediterranean, around Cape Horn, &c. His life was full of adventure, but as no one of his compeers remained who could give to us a connected account of the varied scenes through which he passed, we will simply allude to them in a brief way. When quite a young man he in some way—we cannot now show in what manner—lent a helping hand to the French refugees who wished to flee from the confusion and danger incident to the Haytien Revolution of the Island of St. Domingo, probably about 1803-4, saving other men's lives at the hazard of his own. In the war of 1812 he was captured at sea and taken to Halifax, "whence he was liberated before his turn because he was a mason." In his later years he was commander of the ship "Starr" to Calcutta. I draw from a letter received from a relative of his now in Europe the following: "You are probably informed as to his personal character, his singular rectitude, and the modesty which forever debarred him from the guerdon of his merits. As a merchant he was very successful, making two or three fortunes during his career; but a sailor's thriftlessness, and a heart ever open to solicitation for other's needs, made it difficult for him to retain wealth. He was a man of extensive knowledge of the various countries of the world, and the customs and habits of their people. A man, too, highly interesting in his conversation, and so courteous in his deportment toward those who were with him on the then long voyages to distant India, as to win their highest esteem." It may be added that he was a very handsome man, with a complexion "wonderfully fair" for one who had all his life been a sailor. As a husband and father he had no rival. On a return voyage from Calcutta, and when near Cape of Good Hope, as he stood on the deck of his ship conversing pleasantly with some of

his officers, he was stricken with apoplexy and lived but about two hours. He was buried in the sea, as he had often expressed his desire that the ocean might be his last resting-place if he died at sea. His death took place 31 Dec., 1836. Mrs. Griffing died in Philadelphia 27 April, 1860.

Angelina Griffing, born 8 Feby., 1778, daughter of Capt. Moses Griffing (61) and Sarah (Stillwell) Griffing, married, first, Capt. Hasting of Philadelphia, and had two sons, one of whom died in infancy. Afterward she married Capt. Daniel Hunt, and went to Portland, Maine, to reside. After this her son, George Hasting, by her former marriage, died of yellow fever in the West Indies when about sixteen years of age. Capt. Hunt was young when he began his business life; was made commander of an East Indiaman, "The Cornelia," a ship of twenty-two hundred tons, when he was twenty-one years old; afterward owned and commanded the privateer "Louisa" in the war of 1812-1815. A fine likeness of him is in the family of Mrs. Edwards of Macon, Ga., painted by Rembrandt Peale, Esq., about 1805. Mrs. Angelina Hunt was a woman of great intelligence and fine breeding; one born to have sway over others perhaps, yet possessed of a most kindly nature, ever ready to comfort the distressed, to make a home for the orphans; "she was truly a noble woman." One says of her: "Her memory was excellent, she was a great reader, and had she been of the sterner sex, would have made a good statesman." After the death of Capt. Hunt, Mrs. Hunt removed with her daughters to New York, where she died 5 Aug., 1852, and lies buried in Greenwood Cemetery.

Capt. Joseph Carson Griffing, born 1 Dec., 1781, son of Capt. Moses Griffing (61) and Sarah (Stillwell) Griffing, became a sailor, and when twenty-one years of age commanded a ship. He married Abby Bickley, daughter of Daniel Bickley, a wealthy Philadelphian. The port to which Capt. Griffing sailed was Calcutta. When almost at the head of his profession, and his prospects very flattering, he was taken sick at Calcutta, and for three months was ill in the house of Mr. Return Braddock, a native of New Jersey, but a resident of India. Here he received every kindness and attention which his situation required. He sent many loving messages to his wife and friends in America, whom he was never to meet again. He died 23 July, 1811, and was buried in Calcutta, the place marked by a monument sent from Philadelphia by his wife. She, after some years, became the wife of a Mr. Tallman of Philadelphia.

[Elijah Leete, born 21 Dec., 1753, father of Clarissa Leete (wife of B. Stone), was the son of Solomon Leete, born Sept., 1722. He was the son of William Leete, born 1671, who was the son of Andrew Leete and Elizabeth Jordan (daughter of Thomas Jordan, who came to Guilford, Ct., at its early settlement and returned to England about the same time Rev. Henry Whitfield and Samuel Desboro' did).

Hon. Andrew Leete was the second son of William Leete, who belonged to the Leetes of Evorsden of Cambridgeshire and Midlow of Huntingdonshire, England. He was bred to the law in England, and served as a clerk for a considerable time in the Bishops Court at Cambridge, where, observing the oppressions and cruelties then practiced on the conscientious Puritans, he was eventually led to become a Puritan himself and give up his office. He then came to New England with Rev. Mr. Whitfield, and they, with a few others, settled at Guilford, Ct., and organized the first church in that place. William Leete was Deputy Governor of New Haven colony from 1658 to 1661. He was then elected Governor of the colony, which office he held until the union with

Connecticut. [In 1686 a shipload of Huguenots, or French Protestants, exiles and sufferers for conscience sake, landed on the west shore

of Long Island Sound eighteen miles above the city of New York. The village they founded received the name it now bears, in remembrance of their

“ Own Rochelle, the fair Rochelle,
Proud city of the waters.”

The first church was erected about 1692 or 1693. Within its walls the colony worshipped God unmolested by man, according to the usage of the reformed church in France. The first minister was the Rev. David Boncepos, who accompanied the exiles from their native country. In 1694 he was succeeded by Rev. Daniel Boudet, a native of France. The successor of Boudet, in 1724, was Rev. Pierre Stoupe, also of France. Stoupe was succeeded by a converted Franciscan friar, Rev. Michael Houdin. After the Revolution we find Mr. Andrew Fowler (son of Andrew and Martha Stone Fowler), who had just finished his studies at Yale College, acting as lay-reader to this exiled church from 1781–1786. The succeeding history of this historic church is very interesting. When Mr. Andrew Fowler was admitted to Holy Orders, he entered upon his duties at Charleston, S. C., where his children were born.]

"Aug. 1st, 1869. A dispatch received at a late hour last night, addressed to Mr. John H. Coley, announced the death of Mr. Griffing, in Chicago, last night. This sad news will cause a general feeling of regret in the business community, and among a large circle of personal friends. Mr. Griffing was much esteemed, and a useful and valuable man. His illness originated in a partial sun-stroke which he received at Ogden, a place about twenty miles this side of Salt Lake City. The train on which was the New Haven party, of which Mr. Griffing was one, stopped at the place where the Salt Lake railroad will unite with the Pacific road, and he walked to Ogden, a distance of two miles, in a very hot sun, to see if there were letters there. When arrived at Ogden he found himself much exhausted, but no serious symptoms were manifested until five days after, when he was attacked with brain fever at Chicago, and of which he soon died. He was attended with the utmost care by tender friends in his illness.

"Mr. Griffing has long been identified with the interests of New Haven. He was born in Guilford and came as a young man to this city (1831), and after a few years entered into mercantile life, and for many years conducted, in partnership with a brother, Jasper Griffing, the hardware and iron business. He has filled places of trust in the community. He was a director in the

'Merchants' Bank' from its commencement, and vice-president for many years, which position he held at the time of his death. He had also of late filled the office of president of the 'Mutual Security Insurance Company.'

"He was a prominent director in the Swedes' Iron Company, near Milwaukee, one of the largest manufacturing establishments in the West. His perfect method in mercantile affairs, his promptness in financial matters, his genial disposition and agreeable manners, all secured him a large circle of friends. He was, moreover, a model son, husband, and father."

He died at Chicago, 31 July, 1869.

Frederic Redfield Griffing, born 5 Nov., 1798, son of Nathaniel Griffing (87) and Sarah (Brown) Griffing, obtained such an education as the local schools afforded, and early went into business with his father, who was then engaged in shipping; building his own vessels, and doing a large coasting and West India trade, besides considerable trade with Mediterranean ports. The young man early evinced an aptitude for business, and soon developed traits of character which in later years won for him a place in the front ranks as a comprehensive and sagacious business man. He was one of the originators of the Manhattan Gas-Light Co. of New York City—was a stockholder in the New Haven and Hartford Railroad from its beginning, and instrumental in getting the road extended to Springfield, to connect with the Boston and Albany Railroad. He was largely interested from the first in developing the coal-mining and transporting interests of Pennsylvania, in building the town of Scranton, and many other enterprises, besides being a partner in a large shipping house in New York. One of his last works was the building of the Shore Line Railway from New Haven to New London, to which he contributed largely in funds, influence, and personal services, and which was completed and opened for business a few months before his death. He died 13 Oct., 1852, in the city of New York, while on his way to Pennsylvania to meet a surveying party, who were going to locate a railroad in the coal fields. Although not remarkably robust physically, and having, when a young man, serious pulmonary trouble (which, however, he recovered from after spending several winters in the Southern States and West Indies), he was enabled, by taking proper care of his health, to lead a life of incessant business activity, and accomplish much towards developing the business interests of the country in his day. He was a kind friend, and a dutiful and affectionate son. Never marrying, he made his home with his family at the old homestead, and many were the young men of those days who could date their first success to his assistance, either by money or good advice.

“JULIA GRIFFIN, SCULPTRESS.

“The many friends in Brooklyn of Miss Julia Griffin will be sincerely shocked and pained when they learn of her death, which took place suddenly on the morning of the 17th inst., at her father's residence, in Harlem. She was well and widely known in this city, where the greater portion of her life was spent, and where her earliest associations were formed. Miss Griffin was born in North Lyme, Ct., 11th Sept., 1848, and at the time of her death was thirty years and seven months old. Her parents removed to this city when she was in her early childhood, and here her early education and training were received.

“She early showed herself to be possessed of a mind of uncommon brilliancy, and this, coupled with unusual graces of person and character, soon drew around her hosts of friends. While still quite young she displayed considerable ability as an elocutionist, and won high praise from the poet Whittier, in his home in Amesbury, by her rendering of his ‘Maud Muller.’ She displayed also a genius for art, and turned her attention to drawing and sculpture. She began modeling when quite a child, and as she grew older the passion grew upon her. Our Brooklyn artist, Mr. J. B. Whittaker, became interested in her progress, and for a long time she occupied a place in his studio, where she drew a crayon portrait of Mr. David M. Stone, of the *Journal of Commerce*. Her taste, however, was for modeling, and to that she turned her attention. She enjoyed the privilege of the studio and the instruction of J. Wilson Macdonald, the New York sculptor, and then commenced her career as a sculptress. Among the portrait busts modeled by her were those of President F. A. P. Barnard, of Columbia College, Rev. Dr. E. H. Chapin, of New York (shown at the Centennial Exposition at Philadelphia), General James Jourdan, General Thomas S. Dakin, Judge Brady, of New York, and Mayor Havemeyer, the last named being her most successful production. It was honored with a medal by the American Institute, and a copy was taken to Ireland by the Lord Mayor of Dublin.

“At one of the King's County fairs at the Brooklyn Rink she succeeded Vinnie Ream as a modeler, and attracted extended attention from the superior artistic character of her work. She was an accomplished artist in crayon, and took a special course in anatomical study for artistic purposes. In the Spring of 1877 she went to Europe,

but returned some months ago, broken in health. She had at that time in her studio several unfinished busts which her health did not allow her to complete. The return home did not seem to benefit her health, and she was prevented from resuming the active work of her profession. Death came suddenly, and she was stricken down at a time when her ripening mind gave large promise of future achievements. She was known to a wide circle of literary and artistic friends, to whom she was endeared as much by the winsome sweetness and beauty of her character, as for her brilliant intellect. Her mind was acute, her conversation bright and sparkling, and she displayed a rare faculty for the intuitive perception of philosophical ideas. Her artistic conceptions were grand and lofty, and at times she essayed work beyond her strength. In the circle which she adorned her untimely death has left a void that cannot be filled. She was best loved where best known, and around her young life, cut short in her early prime, there will cluster some of the sweetest and most fragrant of memory's blossoms."]

Rev. Mr. Griffing was for a time settled over the Presbyterian Church at Delhi, N. Y. He was ultimately made Doctor of Divinity by Lafayette College. To quote from a paper prepared by Rev. Addison Ballard, D.D., for the New York *Evangelist*:

“Dr. Griffing was most widely known and will be honorably remembered for the varied and important services which he rendered to Williams College. For eleven years he occupied the chair of Ancient Languages; published for eleven years the Triennial Catalogue; was the first to prepare necrological sketches of its graduates; for

twenty-four years acted as Secretary of its Alumni Association; and by his tact, vigilance, and assiduity, caused its library, of which he had assumed the charge, to be regarded as a model in its plan of working. Dr. Griffing came of good stock. His father, a man of fine parts, was leader, elder, and largely the founder of the church where he lived at Westhampton, L. I. It was while away from home, at the age of twelve, preparing for college in the family of a clergyman, that Dr. Griffing was converted. His deep and pungent convictions resulted in a change so clear and decided, that little room was left for doubt in subsequent life. He ever committed himself with unshaken confidence to God, whatever might be his trials. This perfect trust was a marked feature in his last illness. We count it a special grace that the Father gently drew the heart of His trusting child heavenward by prophetic longings, months before his departure. For more than a year previous, his growth in spiritual things was so marked that none who were near him could fail to see it. During the whole of the preceding winter the life and character of Christ were his constant study, by days during intervals of leisure in the library, and in the evenings at home. So engrossed was he in this study that nothing could divert him from it, not even the fond devices of affection, which feared lest he was getting ready for heaven too soon, and which yearned to detain him longer. He wished the Gospel read to him during his sickness, together with the Psalms, and a selection of hymns which he made for this purpose in the early part of his illness. Feeding on this growing knowledge of Christ, his faith grew likewise, so that he could say, 'I know Him whom I trust.' There was nothing he could not commit perfectly to Him. It did not trouble him, therefore, that he could not form definite views of the future life. When asked, 'Does it seem to you that you will forget us all when you are gone?' he replied, 'I do not know about that; I only know that all will be right. I am sure that I shall meet you all at the last.' Thus without raptures or visions, but relying on the sure word of God, so peacefully and lovingly did he await and meet the end, that dearest friends even amidst their tears, are able to say, 'We can think of no one thing in the circumstances of his death which we could wish otherwise than it was.'—Lafayette College, Easton."

She became a member of the Congregational Church in Guilford at the age of sixteen years, and sustained through life an active and consistent Christian character, not requiring, as do some, the aid of the broad folds of the mantle of charity to hide excrescences or defects. She possessed remarkable conversational powers and was familiar with the details of general history, and with the personal history of a large number of prominent individuals in all parts of the country. A prominent trait in her character was the utter absence of all selfish feeling, and her readiness to give up all personal considerations and preferences in deference to the wishes of her friends. It was on this ground that in early life she was led to decline a matrimonial engagement which offered her position and work in a foreign missionary field. The greater portion of her life was devoted to

the business of teaching, first in her native village and subsequently in the city of New York, and in Hartford, showing herself to be a successful teacher, and gaining the warmest affections of her pupils. She died 25 March, 1880.

With his family he arrived at San Francisco, California, 27 Jany., 1877.
